Recognising colours, shapes, numbers, patterns and solving simple puzzles develops logical thinking.

6. Self-Help & Independence

Children learn washing hands, eating independently, organising belongings and taking responsibility.

7. Emotional Regulation

Teachers help children adjust, express emotions and build confidence away from home.
